Master Conservationist

IAN continues to sponsor the Master Conservationist Program. The cost paid out covers the IAN booklets provided to each participant. Muscatine County Extension, Story County Extension and Dallas County Extension were awarded \$250 each. The total monies spent were \$750. \$1,750 remains in this fund for approximately 7 more workshops.

Junior Naturalist Program

Fox patches were available for 2005. The turtle will be available for 2006. Patches might need to be ordered as needed in the future because IAN allotted \$500 for the fox patches and only \$185 was brought in.

Joe Halbur Scholarship

As of Dec. 31, 2005 the amount in the Joe Halbur Scholarship was \$5,389.38. Naturalist t-shirts were sold to raise money for the fund. The scholarship amount awarded is \$500. Ben Rees, of Marshalltown, was selected as this year's recipient. He began his studies at Cornell College in the fall of 2005. The Joe Halbur Scholarship committee produced a flyer/application form to be distributed to all high schools and colleges. It is also online.

Newsletter

Three newsletters were produced and distributed via email. The newsletter is also online. A few newsletters are delivered by mail.

Grants

District 3 submitted a grant written by Miriam Patton, Charlene Elyea, and Lisa Anderson. The amount given was \$500 for a touchy/feely box and buzzboard to be used at the Clay County Fair.

REAP/CEP Grant Program

IAN received a REAP/CEP grant which will allow 100 IAN members & educators to receive a scholarship to attend the National Association for Interpretation, Region V workshop to be held in Dubuque in April 5-9, 2006. Each scholarship recipient will receive \$200 to offset the cost of the workshop. The grant project has several goals: 1) Provide the financial means for 100 Iowa educators (formal and informal) to attend the workshop. 2) Assess the need for financial assistance for Iowa educators to receive in-service or attend training events. 3) Assess the benefits of attending a workshop at the regional level (were participants able to incorporate learned material into either their professional or personal lives). The grant was a cooperative project between IAN, ICEC and NAI.

IAN Web Page

Strategic Planning Committee
