#### **Master Conservationist**

IAN is again sponsoring the Master Conservationist Program. This program is in the second year of funding. The cost paid out covers the IAN booklets provided to each participant. Mahaska County Extension, Johnson County Extension, Polk County Extension, Wapello County Extension, Black Hawk County Extension, Mills County Extension and Marshall County Extension were award up to \$250 each. The total monies spent were \$1,518. \$982 remains in this fund for approximately 4 more workshops.

# Joe Halbur Scholarship

A total of \$292.96 was raised in 2004. The scholarship amount was increased from \$250 to \$500. Two people applied. Joann McNally was selected as the recipient. She is a student at South Dakota State University. The Joe Halbur Scholarship committee produced a flyer to be distributed to all high schools and colleges. Darrin Siefken stepped down and was replaced by Maria Koschmeder as chair. The committee submitted a proposal that \$150 be allotted for a recipient to fulfill the requirement to attend an IAN workshop in addition to the \$500 scholarship. ExCom approved this proposal.

#### Newsletter

Three newsletters were produced and distributed via email. The last printed newsletter was the January 2004 newsletter. A few newsletters are delivered by mail.

#### **REAP/CEP Grant Program**

IAN did not apply for any REAP/CEP grants this year. REAP/CEP is emphasizing learning outcomes in the evaluation process.

#### IAN Web Page

The IAN web page is located at www.ianpage.20m.com. The web site includes many sections such as the IAN ExCom & Standing Committees, IAN's newsletter, upcoming workshops, professional standards, sponsored programs, publications, membership, job announcements, links and a guestbook. The web site includes the *Guide to Interpretive Services*, grant applications, intern standards available to download and a member's chat room. # **Fund Raising**
